I. MAJOR CHANGES FROM LAST YEAR'S REPORT:

- A. The committee recommended that a by-law proposal to amend 1620 be submitted requiring all first-year coaches to attend coaching classes regarding the fundamentals of coaching.

II. RATIONALE:

- A. The committee felt that the CHSAA and the CHSCA would benefit from a by-law requiring first-year coaches to attend a coaching class that addresses coaching fundamentals that are common to all sports and working with teenaged athletes. The class would not cover "Xs and Os" as the focus would be around the fundamentals that are similar to Inside Out coaching.

III. FINANCIAL IMPACT:

- A. Coaches would incur even more costs while entering an avocation that provides little in the way of compensation as it is. It is estimated that, between coaching registration, first aid/CPR, fingerprinting, etc, coaches are paying nearly \$250 to become a high school coach.

IV. INFORMATIONAL ITEMS:

- A. The Denver Broncos and the CHSAA partnered to recognize a Coach of the Week for the 2017 season. Recipients are selected based on the tenets of the Inside Out Coaching Initiative.
- B. The committee was presented with information from the CHSAA records that show the continued increase in the number of coaches who are registering with the Colorado High School Activities Association.
- C. The Coaching Education Committee voted to show strong support for the newly established Coaches Code of Ethics as developed by the CHSCA and presented by Becky Mudd and Dick Katte.
- D. The committee agreed to forward names to the NFHS for national Coach of the Year consideration.
